

The Yuhaaviatam of San Manuel Nation Externship Program Apply for Fall 2023

The San Manuel Band of Mission Indians has provided funding to the Indian Gaming and Tribal Self-Governance Programs, which are then able to offer externship opportunities to students in the Indian Legal Program. We have found that while externships provide great experiences students in the legal field, these opportunities may be unpaid. To remove this barrier, we offer a \$4,000 monthly stipend over four months, to two students.

Externships must be:

- Located in Phoenix, Los Angeles, Washington, D.C. metro areas, or with a federally recognized Indian tribe
- Unpaid
- In one of these areas:
 - Nonprofit organization working to advance tribal self-governance or Indian gaming interests
 - Government agency where the applicant will assist in carrying out some aspect of the federal trust responsibility owed Indian tribes
 - Tribal government legal or public policy office
 - Tribal government gaming enterprise

Eligible students must be:

- Enrolled 2L or 3L JD student seeking the Indian Law Certificate
- Enrolled MLS student in Indian Gaming, Tribal Self-Governance or Indian Law
- Enrolled LLM student in Federal Indian Law
- Enrolled citizen of a federally recognized Indian tribe
- Able to confirm an externship with an entity described above within one month of approval or the offer may be rescinded. The Indian Gaming and Tribal Self-Governance Programs may provide assistance in finding externship opportunities if requested.

Your application must include:

- Two pages stating what you will learn during the externship
- Current resume or CV
- One letter of recommendation
- A copy of your most recent grades
